## Tune's Notes

"There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven" (Ecclesiastes 3:1). There are certain unavoidable necessities of life, and the book of Ecclesiastes reminds us repeatedly that we dare

not deny them.

But I fear we've mis-read Solomon. Rather than "there is a time for everything," we've read "there is time for *everything*" – a difference of but one letter that turns truth into lie.

On vacation I watched "The Doctors" (not the soap opera) on television one afternoon. Their theme was 'healthy eating' and their prop was "dollar meals." Small hamburger for a dollar. Fries for a dollar. Make it two hamburgers and you've got a three dollar meal with 1500 calories and two days worth of fat. The Doctors suggested healthier alternatives – also costing a dollar.

That day's guest then asked: "How do you have the time to prepare your healthy dollar meals?" And I thought: "Why is it that's a question for our lives? Why do we not have time to eat well?"

And the answer is: because we've filled our lives with so many unnecessary things that we have no time for the necessary and essential – like eating well (as opposed to eating a lot, or eating junk).

We must take time for God – to talk with Him, listen to Him and be involved in what He cares about. We must take time for work (but only just enough. I'm afraid it often steals more than its share and makes slaves of God's free people). We must take time for our spouse, time to love her (him) and enjoy the company. We must take time for our children – time to enjoy their company and teach them how to live, showing them what is important and seeing to their intellectual development (*our* job by the way, not the school system's). We must take time for personal development, exercise, sleep.

In all these areas, there must be balance. Our children cannot be involved in everything, and neither can we. We must focus on the necessary and important, finding balance so that life is and remains the joyful healthy experience God intends it to be. Only that life is a blessing.

## Wednesday Night Out Takes Summer Break

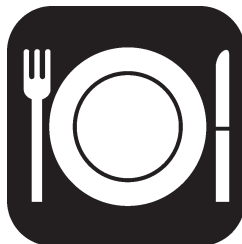
The extremely popular "Wednesday Night Out" dinners here at Falls Church will take a "summer break" during August but will resume this fall.

## 2011 VBS Coming Up in Less Than Two Weeks

The **2011 Vacation Bible School** is coming up soon! The event, designed for children from age 2 through the 6th grade, starts on Friday, Aug. 12 from 6 to 8 pm, and concludes on Saturday, Aug. 13, with hours from 9 am to noon.

**Attention to Parents or to those who bring the children:** There will be a coffee house for the adults who come on Friday night but who don't have any special role to play in VBS. The coffeehouse is a special treat!

This year the program is entitled **“Inside Out & Upside Down on Main Street,”** and emphasizes the parables of Jesus.

*And the Bible memory verse for the event is:*

**Psalm 25:4-5** - “Show me your ways, O Lord, teach me your paths: guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my Savior, and my hope is in you all day long.”

VBS Director **Amanda Venkatesan** envisions the Falls Church building transformed into a town where



children will learn that Jesus' parables about ordinary people or subject, actually were profoundly insightful. As Amanda notes, those stories “...turned lives upside down and hearts inside out” so that people may “...look at themselves and others in new and unexpected ways.”

As the children walk down Gratitude Ave., they will learn about the “Parable of the whiny workers,” Matt. 20:1-16.

Grace Pkwy. directs the children to the “Parable of the warmest welcome,” Luke 15:11-32.

Walking down Compassion Dr., the children will learn the “Parable of the roadside rescue,” Luke 10:25-37.

As they travel Faithfulness Rd., they will hear the “Parable of the master’s money,” Luke 19:12-26.

On Forgiveness Lane, they will learn about the “Parable of the shocking servant,” Matt. 18:21-35.

They are students at **Bailey's Elementary School**, located just a few blocks from here. Bailey's has 1,200 students, over half of whom are on free or reduced-fee lunches due to the family's financial circumstances.
